She was a talented seamstress who made some of her children's clothes when they were younger. She loved photography and became a certified photographer. Norma also loved selling jewelry. She was "Mimi" to her grands and greats and always told her family "I love you." She adored babies and had a magic touch whenever she held one of them.
