Barbara was born March 14, 1933 at her parents' home just outside of Carlisle, Iowa. Her parents were Harley and Mary (Mamie) Reed. They named Barbara Lou and the two names stayed with her all through school. She went to be with Her Lord from the comfort of her own home in Broken Arrow, Oklahoma on Friday, June 6, 2025 at the age of 92 years.

After graduating from Carlisle High School, Barbara went to Lindenwood University in St. Charles, Missouri for 2 years. She met and married a Des Moines florist, William "Bill" Doyle July 12, 1958. They had two boys while living in Des Moines, Mark Reed Doyle and Brian William Doyle.

In 1962, Bill was hired as a Sales Representative for General Electric Company and they moved to Oklahoma City, Oklahoma. Later, to Roswell, New Mexico where Barbara got her Real Estate Brokers license. They were transferred to Amarillo, Texas and Barbara spend the next 25 years in Real Estate where she had her own office and was a Co-Owner of Creative Home Brokers, Inc. She and Bill built a home in the Palo Duro Canyon Country Club in 1983. During their retirement years, they visited all 50 states, 3 times to Hawaii and many times to Alaska, Mexico and various Cruises.

Barbara liked sewing, crocheting and making quilts. She did a lot of painting with oil pastels and made jewelry. They were members of St. Peters Episcopal Church in Amarillo. There, Barbara served as Altar Guild Chairman until she moved to Tulsa in 2016, a year after Bill passed away. Barbara joined Saint Patrick Episcopal Church after moving to Tulsa.
