Barry vonHartitzsch, M.D., F.A.C.P. was born in Wellington, New Zealand on August 4, 1940 to Eric and Edna (Beri) vonHartitzsch. Barry passed away on Sunday, December 1, 2019 in Tulsa, Oklahoma at the age of 79.

Barry earned his Doctorate from the University of Otago in Dunedin, New Zealand. He went on to have a successful career as a Nephrologist. Barry married Valerie Redstone in New Zealand and they were blessed with five children. Barry was a wonderful husband, father and grandfather. He adored his family and loved spending time with them. Barry was a supportive father, always attended his family's athletic events and became involved with Oklahoma Swimming by volunteering as a certified swim meet official. 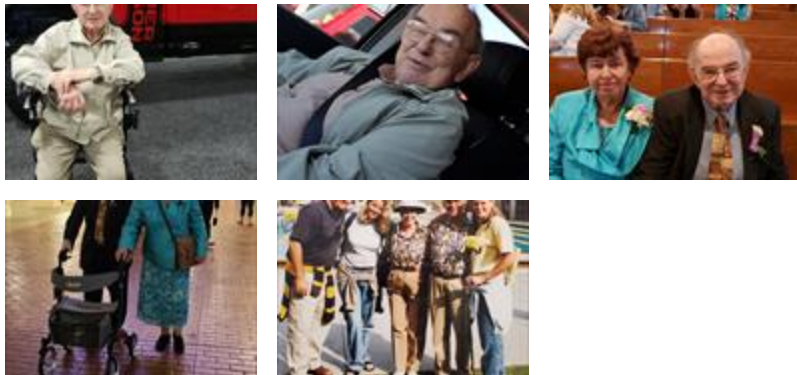
