Bradford Mitchell Campbell was born on Wednesday, November 26, 1952 to father Jack Franklin Campbell and mother, Marie Ethel Baumer Campbell. Brad went to be with Jesus Christ our Lord and Savior, Monday, June 2, 2025, at the age of 72. Brad was a wonderful Godly man, who will be dearly missed by all who knew him.

Brad grew up in both Tulsa and Broken Arrow. Brad attended Alcott Elementary, Gilcrease Middle School, McLain High School and Broken Arrow High School. He graduated from Broken Arrow High School in 1971. He attended NSU in Tahlequah, Oklahoma and ECU in Ada, Oklahoma, for college courses. He married his wife of 47 years, Candy Ellen Campbell, June 3, 1978, in Houston, Texas. Brad went on to become a successful manager, salesman and entrepreneur. While in Houston, Brad was an Area Supervisor for Wendy's International. This lead him to accept a manager position with a Wendy's franchise owner, which took them to Renton, Tacoma and Seattle Washington. They returned to Oklahoma where he became an oil pumper and roustabout for a short time. Leaving the oil patch, Brad began selling mobile homes. Then he dove into the new home building market, wherein, he sold specs and custom built homes. He then became the Sales Manager for some of Broken Arrow's top home builders. Being the entrepreneur that he was, Brad ventured into building a network marketing business in which he became a gifted and articulate motivational speaker, adding that to his list of many

talents. The Campbells then enjoyed owning and operating Parkside Antiques in downtown Broken Arrow. He then returned to building custom homes until he retired due to illness in 2011.

Once Brad became wheelchair bound, the Campbells moved to Bernice, Oklahoma. Brad became a member of the Bernice City Council. Then he was elected Mayor. He served the people of the town of Bernice as Board Member and Mayor for 8 years. He orchestrated many significant and positive changes during his tenure. He was well respected.

During his youth Brad played baseball and football. He enjoyed playing golf and fishing. Brad adored his family and treasured his time with them all. His friendships meant the world to him. He valued his family and friends immeasurably.

Brad always had a big smile. He had a special way with people. He always made everyone feel welcome and validated. He was an extremely understanding and caring person. One of the most forgiving people you've ever known. Brad was a riot and full of laughs. What a fun guy!

He was very inspiring. Even though he was confined to a wheelchair the last 14 years of his life and a chronic pain sufferer, he never complained and always had that welcoming smile. He was always positive. Trying to sum up millions of moments in the life of one irreplaceable human with so many unique and beautiful qualities, an almost impossible task.

More than anything, Brad loved Jesus and had an intimate relationship with him. Brad was at total peace and had complete joy knowing the truths of the Bible, and that he would be resting with Jesus, and spending eternity in heaven with God, the Father and Son. He spent even his final days and hours pointing people to Jesus, making sure they knew him. The Campbells are

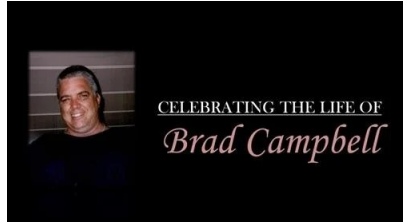

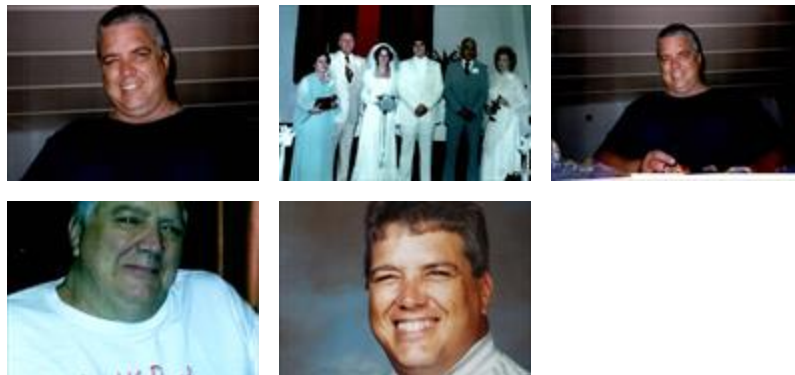
