



## Dale Green

August 6, 1946 - November 10, 2021

Dale Allen Green was born in Neosho, Missouri on Tuesday, August 6, 1946, to Harold and Lola Fern (Thomas) Green. He passed from this life into the presence of his Lord on Wednesday, November 10, 2021, in Tulsa, Oklahoma at the age of 75, holding the hand of his bride, Charlene.

Dale was the second of three children born to Harold and Fern. He attended school in Neosho but moved to Owasso, Oklahoma in his teen years where he met the love of his life, Charlene Rose Myer. The two married on October 11, 1968, six months after he was drafted into the U.S. Army where he served for the first two years of their marriage from 1968-1970. He was a member of the 82nd Airborne Division. After returning from his time in the Army, he and Charlene soon began their family raising two boys and two girls. Dale devoted his entire life to his family. Family was everything to him. He wanted his children and grandchildren to always know unconditional love and affection, but he also wanted them to know how to play and have fun! He loved being surrounded by children and even raised some extra ones too! Dale was always coaching, playing with toys, chasing kids or finding a way to make them laugh. He loved being on the boat at Ft Gibson Lake with his kids and great grandkids. He also wanted Charlene to know his devotion. He was always chasing her around the house too! They could often be found dancing with each other in their spare moments.

He began his long career as a journeyman lineman for AEP/PSO where he worked faithfully for over 40 years, making lots of friends in that business. Dale was a strong and proud lineman. He worked countless nights through storms to get power back on for communities. He loved to train new apprentices and keep them safe on the job. Dale was a lifelong University of Oklahoma Sooner fan, but everyone knew that as much as he loved his Sooners, they were a distant second to his wife and their children and grands. Dale believed in living every second of life to its absolute fullest. Even living through ten years of Parkinson's Disease, he never once complained. He was always just trying to find a way to keep going and to keep helping others. He was an extraordinary human being that will be greatly missed by all those who knew and loved him.

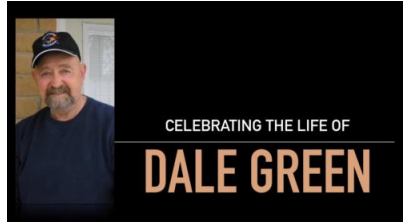
