David Madison Cooper was born on Wednesday, July 30, 1952 in Tulsa, Oklahoma, the son of Lawrence Leroy and Janet Lorraine (Laird) Cooper. He passed this life on Thursday, October 12, 2023 at St. Francis Hospital in Tulsa, surrounded by his beloved family and friends. He was 71 years of age.

David was a 1970 graduate of East Central high school in Tulsa. He was a proud veteran of the United States Army, serving as a member of the Special Forces, 101st Airborne Division, then as a Drill Sergeant. “*Memories of David. Where to begin? I've known David for about 59yrs. We first met in Junior High School. We were the same age and ended up in many of the same classes and sharing the same experiences. In High School we worked on and then raced cars together (He had a killer Dodge), played football together, chased some of the same girls together and graduated together. East Central High School Class of 1970. After that we attended some of the same college classes together. I remember a memorable road trip we took together to Dallas to get a job. He drove us in his 1967 Dodge Charger. Everything was going smoothly when he suddenly asked me if I was OK with his driving. Confused I said that I was. That was when he advised me to look at the speedometer. We were going in excess of 120MPH. Man that Charger was smooth. That was when I decided to buy a 1969 Dodge Charger. In fact, it was David who was working at a car dealership who located one for me that I ended up buying. We ended up not getting the jobs in Dallas and sort of drifted apart. He joined the US Army and I joined the Tulsa Police Dept. We both ended up getting married, having children and moved on with our lives. Years later, my oldest daughter Catherine would come home from school and talk about a girl she was friends with, her name was Courtney Cooper. After a while the girls put two and two together and discovered that their fathers were good friends in High School. That is how I reconnected with David and met his lovely wife Pam. Catherine and Courtney would remain best friends for life. David and I then shared the experience of raising teenage girls. He would occasionally meet me at work and ride along with me on Patrol. I would sometimes run into Courtney as she was an EMT for EMSA for a while. David never left you wondering where he stood on an issue. He was first and foremost totally devoted to his family. He was a patriot, serving in several branches of the Military. He stood up for what was right and didn't back down. I still remember a time in High School when he stood up for his sister. He was a man's man and a loyal friend and I will miss him. The last time that I saw my friend was July 7, 2023 at my daughter Catherine's funeral. It was the worst day of my life. David, Pam and Courtney were there to share my loss. David*

joined me in carrying Catherine's casket to her final resting place. I'll always love him for that. God bless you David. May you rest in peace.
