David Woodburn Wentworth was born on Sunday, July 3, 1932, to Howard and Cora (Burrows) Wentworth. He died on December 16, 2021, in Tulsa, Oklahoma at the age of 89 after living a full, rich, and meaningful life.

He shared these joys with his family. David married Jeanne (Salter) Wentworth and together they had two sons, Peter and Howard, both of whom carried on his legacy and memory through children of their own.

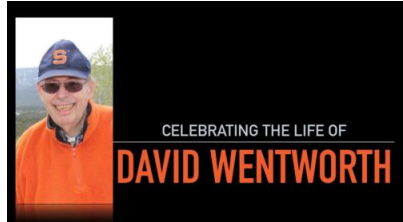
