She worked as an X-Ray and MRI tech at St. Francis in Tulsa, at the Ardmore hospital, at Deaconess Hospital in Oklahoma City, and before gaining her radiology tech certification she spent a couple of years in Dallas, Texas, at Baylor University Hospital. Her ambition always was to work in the medical field.

Beth loved spending time with her family; she was family famous for wearing her fun deer antlers at Christmas and rabbit ears at Easter. Her hobbies were playing video games, and reading; additionally, she was a cat lover and as a result managed to rescue and collect several cats in her lifetime. She was also family famous for her green bean casserole at every family dinner—each time she “doctored” the recipe however she felt at the time, and it was always great, never any left over. As long as she was able, Beth was an active and loving aunt to her nieces and nephew. She will always be so missed by those who loved her deeply.

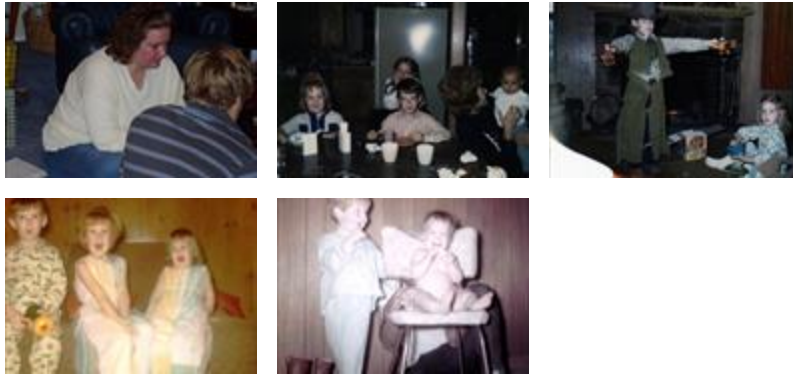
