Born February 20, 1936 to Cecil and Bertha Palmer, Farrell was the fifth of nine children, and his siblings were his lifelong friends. A longtime Broken Arrow resident, he was raised and attended school in the Bixby area.

He was a proud veteran of the United States Air Force and was stationed in Japan and Korea as a very young man, directly after the Korean cease fire. In his career, he was a code welder and an x-ray technician. Then, for several years he worked locally and across the country as an inspection consultant for Bechtel, Fluor, Western Supply and P.G. & E.

Farrell was predeceased by his parents, his brothers, Max, Jack and Jerry Palmer, and his sisters, Laverne Paddock, Pat Henderson and Reba Edelman.

He is survived by his wife of sixty-five years, Joy Dean (Lamb) Palmer; his brother Sam Palmer and his wife Wanda, his sister Sue Clark; his son Timothy Palmer and his wife Rebecca, his daughter, Jill Palmer, and his son Blake Palmer and his wife Gretchen; his grandchildren, John Snowden and Lisa Snowden, and Lisa's husband, Allen Parker. He is also survived by many nieces and nephews and their children.

For many years, as a hobby he liked to buy broken bicycles at garage sales, fix them, and give them to children who did not have bikes.

His farm background taught him to fix almost anything and he had high standards for quality work. He always emphasized that safety was the most important aspect of any job.
