Harold Hackney, "Hack," of Broken Arrow, passed away Saturday, May 4, 2019 at the age of 89.

A funeral service honoring his life will be held 10:00 a.m., Thursday, May 9, 2019 at Hayhurst Funeral Home Chapel. Friends may visit Hack at the funeral home Wednesday from 11:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m., with the family receiving friends from 6:00 to 8:00 p.m.

Hack was born Sunday, June 9, 1929 in Fredonia, Kentucky to Walter and Marie (Booker) Hackney.

Hack honorably served his country during the Korean Conflict as a member of the United States Air Force. After his honorable discharge he came to Tulsa, Oklahoma to study at Spartan School of Aeronautics and Technology and went on to work at McDonnell Douglas Aircraft Manufacturing. While working there he met and married the love of his life, Ava Perry. Although they did not have children together her children considered Hack their own. He was proud to be called "Papa Hack" by all the family.

His love of flying and aircraft continued throughout his life. He was active in Freemasonry as a member of Daylight Lodge# 542 as well as a member of the Tulsa Scottish Rite Bodies in Tulsa.
