You loved my kids and they love you. When I asked about some of the favorite things about you that they wanted to share these were a few answers:

Angelica said you always called her Hotrod and she looked forward

to her "Hey Hotrod!" greeting anytime the family got together. Eli said he loved your sense of humor. You were always asking him about his girlfriend and giving him a hard time because he said he didn't have one. Bre loved making the special chocolate cake for you that Mom always made. She was looking forward to making it again for you.

You always took an interest in John and Mason and their soccer activities and asked how they were doing. Josh could tell many stories of his own. Some may be a little too colorful to share. I know you and Michael shared a lot of bantering about the OSU cowboys and many other things, even how mean your sister could be. True, not true.....For me, I would have to say your sense of humor too. No matter how serious anything was, like your first surgery, you found a way to make something funny about it. When the recovery nurse asked if you knew what they did when you were in surgery, you answered, "They took an apple out of my head". The nurse was mortified because she didn't know why you said that. I was laughing and said, well, his sense of humor is still here. I explained that the tumor was the size of an apple and that's why you said it.

I could share hundreds of fun times and I will always cherish the moments we have had together. So until we meet again, I will miss you tremendously and reminisce on all of those good times.

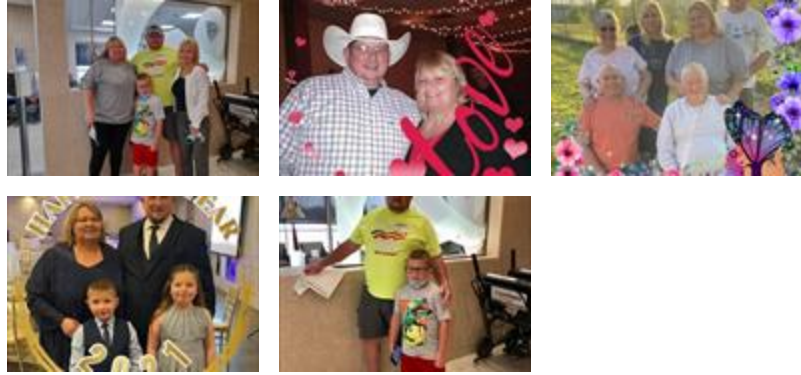
