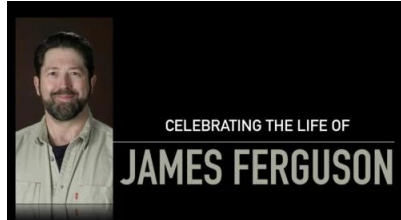

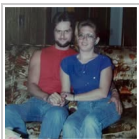

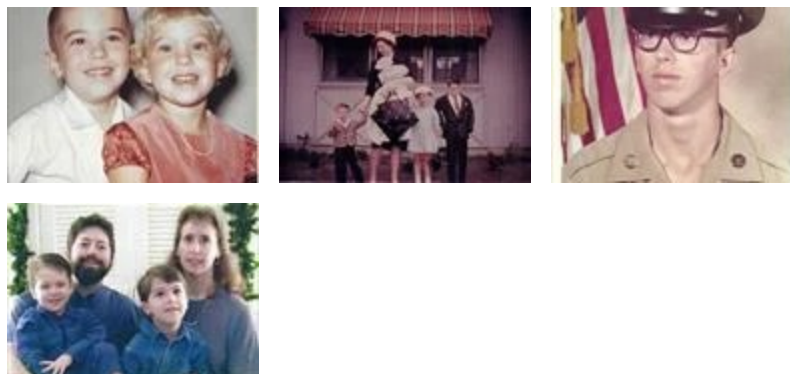

They married and were thrilled to welcome Patrick and Devon in the next few years. James found a niche working in sound engineering and design as he worked with our Dad, Allan, in Ferguson & Associates, designing and installing church organ and sound systems, in addition to volunteering at churches. He later accepted a position as Sound Engineer at TBN and was widely recognized for his knowledge.

James and Janine had Christ at the center of their marriage and have been involved at Church on the Move for many years, serving in multiple capacities.
