Janice B Anderson was born in Muskogee, Oklahoma on July 19, 1936, to William Gerald Hudson and Nina (McCullough) Hudson. She died on June 25, 2024. She grew-up attending Broken Arrow Public Schools, graduating in 1954. Janice attended the University of Oklahoma where she played the saxophone in the Pride of Oklahoma Marching Band and graduated with a BS in Accounting in 1958.

While attending college, Janice met D.C. "Andy" Anderson and they were married on July 11, 1959. They were married for 63 years until Andy's passing on January 1, 2023. Janice was a part-time and full-time bookkeeper over the years for various businesses including Sheridan Lanes Bowling Alley in Tulsa. Janice enjoyed volunteering for many organizations including the Broken Arrow Historical Society, Meals on Wheels and Broken Arrow Neighbors. She had years of fun, traveling, riding bicycles, playing tennis and bridge with her friends. Living on the Broken Arrow farm where their girls were raised, she and Andy appreciated life on the edge of town. Today, Broken Arrow Events Park sits where Janice annually planted and harvested a large garden and often helped round-up one of Andy's rouge heifers that founds its way out of the fence. Janice was well read, loved to cook, enjoyed watching tennis and was known for her quick wit.

She is survived by her two daughters, Gerri Petty (Scott) and Holly Doyle (Joe) as well as six grandchildren, Catherine Petty Ayala, Will Petty, Brendan Doyle, Andrew Doyle, Luke Doyle and Emma Doyle. She is also survived by

her sister, Surilda Hudson. Janice was predeceased by her husband Andy, parents Gerald and Nina and her brother Jack Hudson.
