Lonnie Lee McEntire was born the son of Homer and Amanda (Baker) McEntire on Sunday, July 28, 1929, in Bruno, Arkansas. He passed away at his home on Saturday, June 20, 2020, at the age of 90.

Lonnie served in the Army from October, 1950 – November, 1951, during the Korean War. He married his bride, Emma Geraldine Doggett, known as "Gerri". They raised two sons. Lonnie was a hardworking man. He was a welder by trade and retired from Paul Mueller Company, Springfield, Missouri, in 1982.
