A few years after moving back to Tulsa, Dorothy would meet the love of her life, Noble Kime.

This marriage brought Louise a Daddy and a new sister, Kathie. Kathie got a new mother in

Dorothy as her previous Mother had passed away. Louise and Kathie became best friends in due

time. Louise's many loves included: traveling with her family, school, reading

books and more

books, history, Girl Scouts and being with her family

Her Sister Kathie had two little toe-headed boys, Todd and Scotty. Later a baby sister, Lindsey,

came along. And Louise loved them all very deeply. Lindsey also became her Aunt Louise's

personal hairdresser.

Louise, her cousins, plus several later additions, Maggie and Julie all enjoyed getting together to

eat and party.

In March of 1979, Jimmy Hamilton met Louise and so their journey began.

Jimmy. A week or so later, the two started dating and soon fell in love. The

following year they

were married on June 7th 1980 in Tulsa Ok. The Hamilton family all

welcomed and embraced

Louise into their lives.

Louise and Jimmy began their life together in a house measuring 11' x 34' on

Jimmy's

homeplace. Louise enjoyed the cattle that they raised and especially the baby calves. In 1984

they moved to Vinta, and then back to Tulsa in 1988. In 2003 they moved to

Broken Arrow, in

the former home of Jimmy's Mom, Roberta Hamilton. So began the annual

tradition of "The

Halloweenie Roast" which lasted for over 20 years and often hosted as many as 80 plus people

of both family and friends. She always enjoyed making the custom invitation for "The Halloweenie Roast" as well as the good times this event brought. Her joy and creativity continued with her love of quilting.

Louise worked for years as a secretary at OSU College of Osteopathic Medicine and retired from that work in 2002. She and Jimmy were partners in Niagara Plumbing and Mechanical from 2002 until Jimmy's Retirement in 2020. This partnership allowed Her to be able to care for her Mother Dorothy in time of need. In December 2011 Louise had a kidney transplant after several years on dialysis. It was a bumpy start but after almost 2 months she was well enough to come home. Jimmy was able to stay and care for Her in Oklahoma City during these months thanks to

long-time friends and loyal employees, Doug Kelley, Ulices Ruiz and Wade Moss with special thanks to Jimmy's lifelong friend, Casey Goodwin.

Louise continued to overcome great health obstacles having a heart valve replacement in 2016 which allowed her to continue to thrive. She was extremely resilient and came back from more than just a few serious health issues of which Jimmy continuously guarded and cared for her. Jimmy could not have cared for Louise as well as he did without the support of all of their

friends and family. He often said that Louise was one of the mentally toughest people he ever knew, yet one of the most fragile. Many people told her over the years that she was an inspiration to them. She would battle back when she appeared to be defeated. Louise and Jimmy's good friend of over 34 years, Marion Williams, would often do many loving things for Louise and she referred to Louise as her Hero. Marion was also their German teacher which inspired Her and Jimmy to travel several times to Germany allowing them to discover and trace World War 2 events and German culture which they both thoroughly enjoyed. Louise loved Jimmy, her family, her little dog Dolly and above all, her God. Jimmy wants you all to know that Louise died a wealthy woman and most of that wealth is sitting in this church right now. Goodbye and may God be with you and Louise.
