October 30, 1951 - November 3, 2025

Mark Brian McGee, affectionately known by friends and family as “Mad Dog” or “Marko,” passed away peacefully at his home in Broken Arrow, Oklahoma, on November 3, 2025, at the age of 74.

Born on October 30, 1951, in San Diego, California, Mark spent his early years near Detroit before moving to New Jersey, where he would later meet the love of his life, Joan. Mark and Joan were high school sweethearts and married in 1973. They shared 52 beautiful years together, building a life rooted in love, commitment, and family.

A proud graduate of Oklahoma State University, Mark earned his Bachelor of Science in Industrial Arts Education. He went on to dedicate 40 years to Flintco and Oakridge Builders, where he built a reputation for integrity, hard work, and being “Mad Dog”. He was also loyal to OSU and the New York Yankees. He rarely missed an opportunity to passionately cheer them on. Mark’s greatest pride was his family—especially his grandsons Aidan, Finn, Sullivan, and Mace. Whether tailgating at Oklahoma State, enjoying summers at the Jersey Shore, or taking walks with his “grandpups,” Mark showed his love through presence, consistency, and actions.

He is survived by his devoted wife, Joan; his sons, Matthew (and his wife Jenny) and Andrew (and his wife Kris); his daughter, Katie (and her husband Eric); and his cherished grandsons, Aidan, Finn, Sullivan, and Mace and sister, Pamela Adamczyk. He was preceded in death by his parents, Patrick and Rose McGee and his brother, Craig Price.

Funeral mass will be celebrated Monday, November 10th at 11AM at St. Benedict Catholic Church. Viewing will be the day before, Sunday, November 9th from 2-6PM with visitation with the family present from 2-4PM. In lieu of flowers, the family suggests honoring Mark's memory by taking a walk with your loved ones—or your dog—and cheering for the Yankees or Cowboys, just as he would have wanted.

drive away).

Most days ended with catching up about work, talking about the next day but it always ended with one of us getting a call from one of our wives which spurred us to jump up, grab the last of the ice tea, and rush home.

I learned a lot from Mark, he was a professional mentor to me and many others, but if you were really paying attention, he showed you how to care for people in his own special way.

As I reflect back on my Journey, I am grateful for my time with Mark B. McGee a.k.a. "Bossman" or outside of work, just Mark.

I have this saying, "You are where you are supposed to be when you are supposed to be there, you hear and say what you need to say or hear when you need to hear or say it", relating this to Mark, he was there in my life when I needed him and I am thankful God put him in my life.
