*Love you forever Mother and you are and always will be a part of me.*

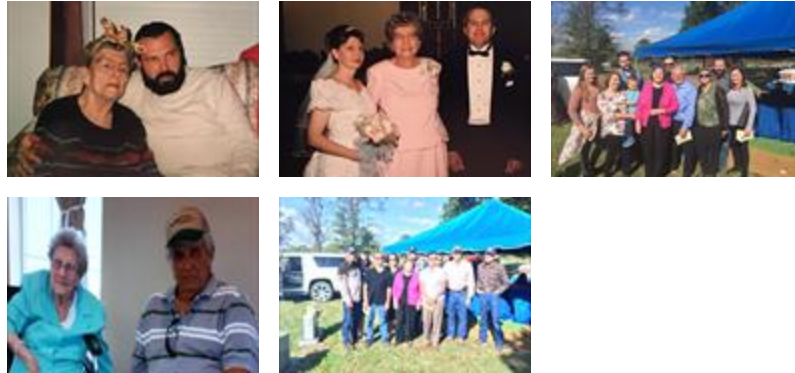
