

Noah L. Schriener

February 25, 2000 - January 19, 2018

A celebration of the life of Noah Schriener will be 1:00 p.m., Wednesday, January 24, 2018 at Whispering Hills Church of Christ. Burial will follow at Park Grove Cemetery. Friends may visit the funeral home on Tuesday from 9:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m.

Noah Lars Schriener was born at St. Francis Hospital, Tulsa, 6 weeks early, on February 25, 2000 to Ronald Dean Schriener and Lorna Jean Erickson Schriener. He had an 8-year old brother, Alex, who was eager to protect him and teach him about dirt, hot wheels, balls, and Legos. When he was in 2nd grade, he gained a beautiful little sister, Lillian. As a small boy, his favorite toys were hot wheels, dirt, bow and arrows, guns, but especially musical toys.

Noah was a special "little man" from the beginning. He was such a cute easy baby that just needed to be around people or be outside to be content. Noah attended Small World Learning Academy and Summit Christian Academy from 2 years to 5th grade. He then attended Middle School at Sequoyah and Childers. That was where he discovered his love of drama and his trombone. Noah attended the Freshman Academy, in which he had the lead in Snow White, as Prince Charming. He also then started in E Jazz, which he loved dearly. He was taking all pre-ap classes in all available subjects and was in the National Junior Honor Society. At Broken Arrow High School, he was inducted into the National Honor Society. He was a proud member of the

National Championship Pride, as well as E Jazz. He also greatly enjoyed American Sign Language. He loved his math and chemistry classes.

Noah was also a member of Boy Scouts of America, Troop 930. He loved the Scouts, with the camaraderie, the laughs, adventures, and learning many things about many things. He went white water rafting, rappelling, caving, hiking, mountain climbing, survival camp outs in the middle of winter, and 10-day canoe trips. He was notorious for being accident prone, which included falling down cliffs, many sprains, several burnt up shoes, sliced infected fingers, and his sleeping bag and coat getting caught on fire while he was still in them. Noah loved being outdoors. He loved his 3 types of bows and his many types of knives. He worked very hard for many years to achieve the rank as an Eagle Scout in December of 2016, with the help of many along the way. He was immensely proud of this rare achievement.

Noah's greatest love was the LORD. At a very young age of 8, Noah realized that he was lost without the LORD and took on the LORD in baptism. Noah read his Bible fervently. Noah went to many church camps. Several summers, he participated in Broken Arrow Church of Christ dramatime for Vacation Bible School, involving practices 6-10 hours a week for many weeks. In summers, he loved going to Future Preacher Training Camp, in which he would study the Bible 6+ hours a day, and learn how to put together a sermon. Noah began delivering short sermons from the podium at the age of 12 at his beloved church home, Whispering Hills Church of Christ. Noah was very involved in Leadership Training for Christ every spring. He was always in 8+ areas of training, requiring 4-6 hours a week for several months. He was a servant to shut ins and the widows, performing chores or delivering meals. Noah lived his faith and was eager to share his joy for the LORD with anyone willing to listen.

Music was a great outlet for him. Noah loved the perfection and discipline in

the PRIDE. The excellence of the team was a great source of pride for him. Noah loved playing with his baritone section in the summer ultimate frisbee and badminton to stay in shape. He loved concert band as well. Jazz music really set his heart on fire. On a nice spring day, Noah could be seen cruising in his car, windows down, with the radio blasting....classical music.

Noah, in his young life, lived it to the fullest. He traveled to 27 states and 3 countries. He had a many vast interests and hobbies. Noah was a very kind and generous person from a young age. When he was 4, he gave his favorite candy to someone else wanted it. Noah would seek to comfort those who were struggling. He had such gratitude for all of his opportunities. His kind eyes would light a room. His quirky humor was delightful to all, except his teachers, and his compassion was evident to all.

Noah Lars Schriener, and his ever-smiling face, was preceded in death by his paternal grandparent, Bobby and Roberta Schriener; as well as his maternal grandparents, Lawrence Gene Erickson, Lou Erickson Davis, and Loren Davis. He is sorrowfully survived by his parents, Ron and Lorna Schriener; brother Alex Schriener, Tulsa; sister Lillian, of home; Aunt Karen Schriener, of McPherson, KS; Uncle Terry and Aunt Lois Moyer, of Salina, KS; PRIDE family, WHCOC family, as well as a whole host of other extended family and friends.

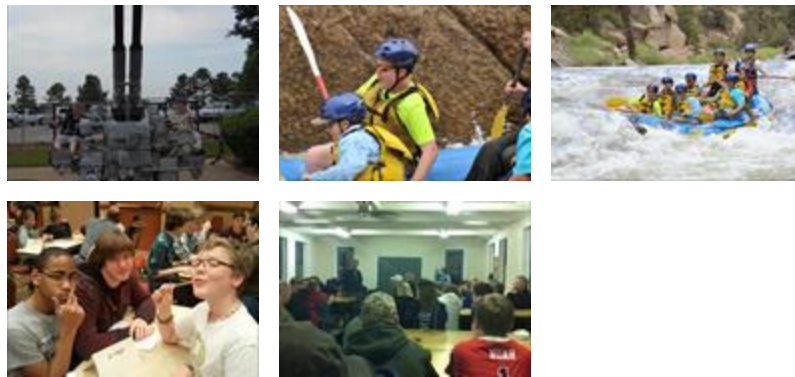
