Patrick Lynn Horn was born on Tuesday, December 24, 1945 in Oswego, Kansas to Thomas and Juanita (Forkner) Horn. He was one of three children born to Thomas and Juanita. He passed from this life on Monday, June 7, 2021 in Tulsa, Oklahoma at the age of 75.

He met Connie Kellogg and they married in Chetopa, Kansas on September 11, 1965. He was a weapon loader on jet planes for the U.S. Air Force. 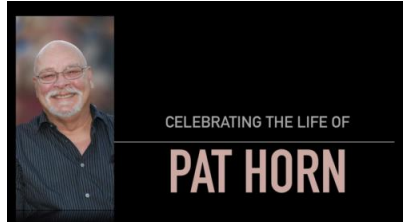
