Several of us have special recipes in our collections that came from Pearl. She had a green thumb. She planted flowers at her home and with Brenda and finally some at the Prairie House. She loved music and dancing and also colored pictures for us. She was an Honors student and completed an advanced degree while working full-time. She was a very disciplined, dedicated and tireless worker. I don't think she missed a single day of work at Blue Cross Blue Shield when she was doing her breast cancer treatments 20 years ago. Pearl was quite athletic. 30 years ago a group of us from Williams played tennis several times a week. She had a great serve. She

walked laps on her lunch hour with Wilma and Brenda in the Williams building both when she was a Williams employee and then later as a NEWFIELD employee She was early to bed and early to rise ... so much so that some of her Williams Energy co-workers teased her saying she was ready to eat lunch at 10am. She ate clean and healthy, but she also loved pizza and beer and splitting nachos with Brenda. Pearl was smart, funny, kind and gracious. She was a loyal friend, and she had the very best laugh. We respected her, admired her and loved her. I will remember Pearl with that big, beautiful laugh. Someone said memories are moments that refuse to be ordinary. Pearl was anything but ordinary. 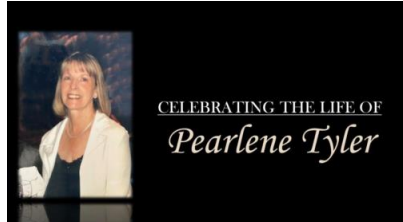
