Randy Duane Marquis was born in Wichita, Kansas, December 15, 1968 to Howard and Betty Marquis of Haysville, Kansas. He was the 3rd of four boys. Randy attended Haysville schools and graduated from Campus High School in 1987 and attended Mid America Nazarene College.

Randy began working for Broadway Mortuary when he was 16, where he learned to serve people in their greatest time of need. At age 18 he began dating a quiet, shy girl from the church youth group named Marci Starr and four years later they were married on June 8, 1991.

After 10 years of working for the funeral home, Randy began sensing God's call on his life to full-time ministry. He and wife, Marci moved to Arlington, TX in 1996 where he served as Children's Pastor for 14 years at Arlington First Church of the Nazarene. While there, they had two daughters, Meleah and Morgan.

In 2010, they moved to Broken Arrow, Oklahoma where he has served as Children's Pastor at Tulsa Regency Park Church of the Nazarene until present.

Randy went to see his Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ and received his eternal reward Monday, May 13, 2019.

He is survived by his wife-Marci, daughters-Meleah and Morgan, parents-Howard and Betty Marquis of Vinita, Oklahoma, brother-Kip Marquis and wife Jonnetta of Vinita, Oklahoma, brother-Rick Marquis of Welch, Oklahoma and brother-Charky Marquis and wife Shelia, of Corsicana, Texas, as well as many
