Shortly after being married Gene enlisted in the army and they went from their small town to Washington DC where Gene served in the Honor Guard. Reva Jewell bravely ventured out and found a job and learned how to navigate the big city.

Their two daughters, Ruthann and Joyce, were born while they lived in Mt View. Because of a severe drought, Reva and Gene left the farm and moved to Shawnee, Oklahoma where they continued to raise their daughters, were very active in the First Baptist Church and made lifelong friends.

After Shawnee, they also lived in Moore, Oklahoma and Joplin, Missouri before settling in Broken Arrow, Oklahoma in 1966. They have been active members of First Baptist Church for many years and in the last years loved their Oasis Sunday School Class.

Everyone would agree that Reva Jewell was well known for her hospitality. She loved having people in her home and always made them feel very welcome. She was also well known for the delicious meals she would prepare. Being in her home for a meal was always a treat.
