Steve was born in Shawnee, Oklahoma on Thursday, January 9th, 1947, the son of Kenneth and Dorothy (Mize) McDonald. He died in Broken Arrow, Oklahoma on Tuesday, June 12th, 2018. He was 71 years of age.

Steve was a graduate of John Marshall High School in Oklahoma City. He attended the University of Central Oklahoma and served in the United States Air Force. 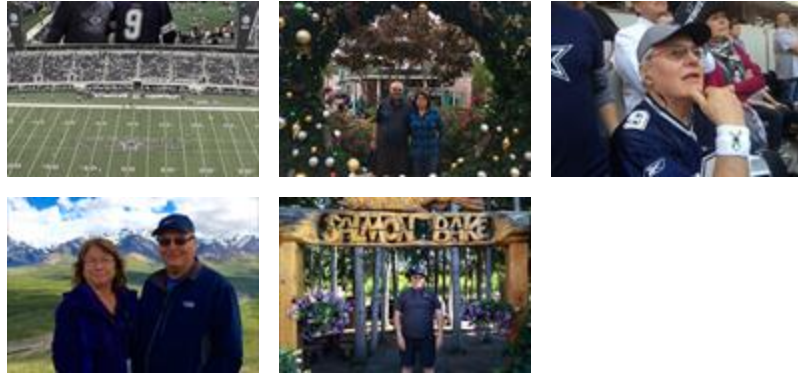
