Roberta Sue Smith was born on Wednesday, May 31, 1933 in Green Forest, Arkansas the daughter of John Varnel and Inez (Longfellow) Wisdom. She passed this life at her home in Tulsa, Oklahoma on Wednesday, March 25, 2020. She was 86 years of age.

Sue was a 1950 graduate of Green Forest, Arkansas High School. She worked as a secretary to the County Supervisor of Schools in Berryville, Arkansas from 1950 to 1955. On May 21, 1955 she was married to Hugh Thomas Smith and they made their home in Tulsa, Oklahoma. Hugh preceded her in death on March 29, 2004.
