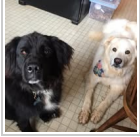

Grandma and I had good times together. In first grade, when I didn't feel like going or want to go to school, she would let me stay home with her. She often told me not to "monkey around" when I would go upstairs to watch tv. I remember hunting for Easter eggs that were filled with pennies as a kid and looking for that one that had a little something more than pennies inside. I liked it when she would fix a roast for dinner and ask us to stay. I remember her making a pallet for me to sleep on in her bedroom or in the sun room at the house in Rogers when I would spend the night. When I spent time with her and grandpa in Rogers, she taught me how to do embroidery and we would go shopping in downtown Rogers. When Grandma and Grandpa lived in Rogers, we took several trips to Eureka Springs, War Eagle, and Fayetteville. During one trip to Fayetteville, to go to the mall, Grandma and I were playing with her ruby ring. We dropped it and could not find it. Grandma made Grandpa pull over so that we could look for it. Thankfully, we found it. I guess we shouldn't have been "monkeying around!" Telling this story always gave grandma a good laugh. Grandma and Grandpa loved each other very much. Soon after they were engaged, when grandpa was out of town on business, he wrote her a letter and addressed it to "My Dearest Darling Angel." In the letter he described the ring he bought for her and told about how he couldn't wait to give it to her in person. Grandma missed Grandpa after his passing. She enjoyed having mom read this letter to her. Instead of being sad that she is gone, we should be happy that she is now healthy again and that Grandpa has been reunited with his "Dearest Darling Angel."
