Willis passed away on Wednesday, August 8, 2018 at the age of 83.

Willis graduated from high school at Western High School in Iowa and went on to attend Calvin College. He enlisted in the United States Army and served his country until his honorable discharge. Willis was an owner and partner in Duininck Companies. He served as the President of the National Asphalt Pavers Association. He was an entrepreneur and community leader.

Willis met Joan Lois Venema at Calvin College in Grand Rapids, Michigan and married her there on June 22, 1957. Their union was blessed with four sons. Willis was a wonderful husband, father, grandfather and great-grandfather. He adored his family and friends and loved spending time with them.

I love you Grampa!*



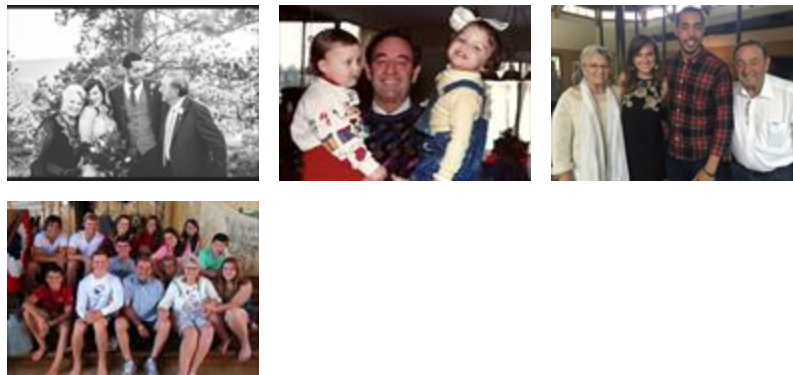
